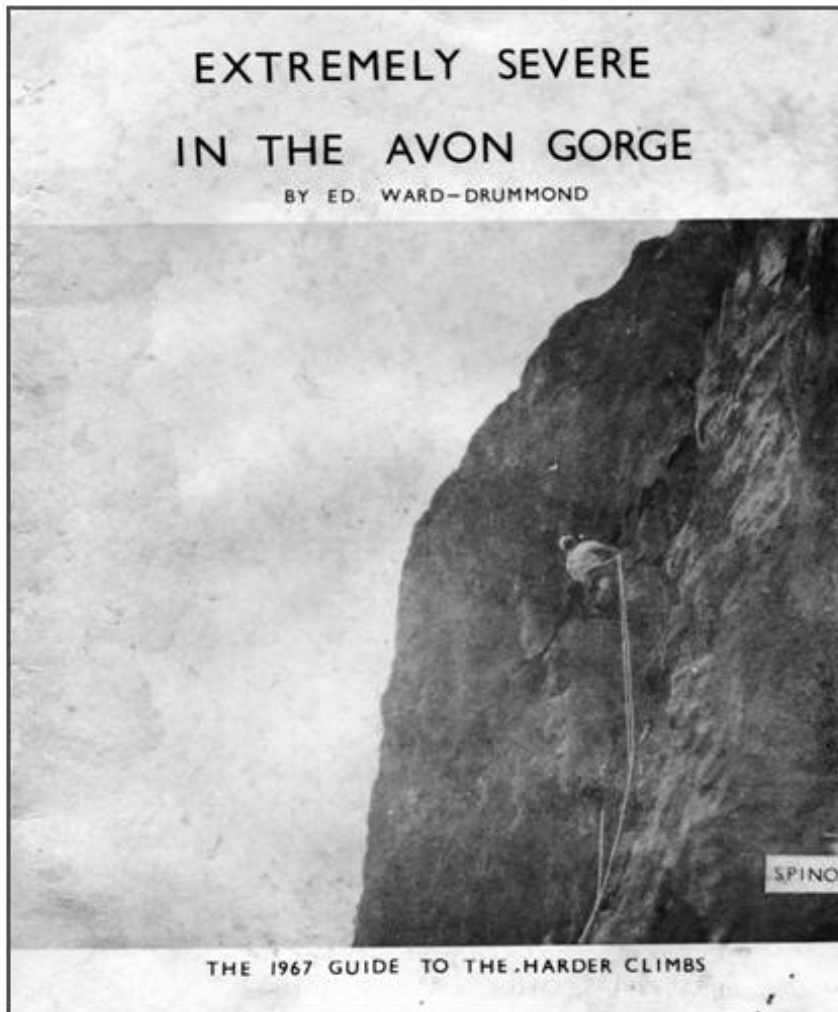

1. Abraham, A.P: **BEAUTIFUL LAKELAND: Abraham, Keswick; 1920: (2<sup>nd</sup>) edition.** Hardback, 52 pages, 32 monogravure plates (including one on front cover) by G.P Abraham of Keswick, 28.5cm. Head of spine lightly bumped with a 1cm joint split reglued (darkened) at head and base, corner tips also reglued; foxing and browning mainly confined to outer page-edges and endpapers, overall a VG presentable copy. *General commentary on the Lake District; enhanced with fine Abraham photographs of the period:* £10.00

A little very minor regluing spine ends and rear corners, front board blotchy and a little slight age-staining, rear board less so; hence a G+ presentable copy of an early and rare Mont Blanc book. This copy of a few printed for private circulation has minor alterations on page 9, 31 and 41, which were presumably altered (see 'Introduction' in book ) by the author on his return to England. Also Meckly ("Mont Blanc The Early Years - A Bibliography of Printed Books from 1744 to 1860"), states that the first edition was known to exist in three variants, with either no plates, or five or six plates; this copy does not have plates. The author made the twentieth ascent of Mont Blanc - see A.J. Vol. 25, p.631: £450.00

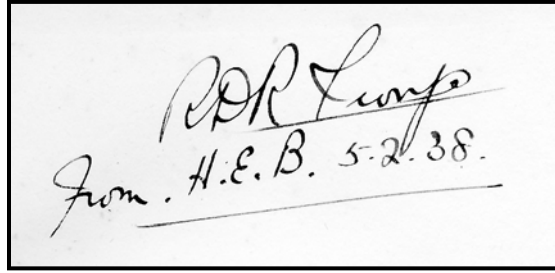
